



<div>Keep left</div> <div></div>	<p>In New Zealand, traffic travels on the left-hand side of the road and the driver sits on the right of the car. When you are turning, you should be careful to the left side. Remember to keep your eyes on the road ahead. It is easy to draw your attention to the beautiful parts in New Zealand</p>
<div>One lane (人行道) bridge</div> <div></div>	<p>Many roads in New Zealand have one lane bridges on them. Any of the signs shown in the left picture mean that you are coming to a one lane bridge.</p>

	<p>Slow down and check for traffic coming the other way. The smaller arrow (箭头) shows which direction has to give way.</p>
<p>Animals on the road</p> 	<p>Watch out for farm animals on the road, especially in the countryside. When you see them, please slow down. You may need to stop and let the animals go past you or move slowly up behind and follow the farmer's instructions.</p>
<p>Seatbelts</p> 	<p>It is a law that all the drivers must wear their seatbelts. If you are caught not wearing your seatbelt, you will be fined.</p>

B

3D printing technology may not be a new thing in some foreign countries. But in May this year, at Shenzhen Convention and Exhibition Center (深圳会展中心) . Many visitors were attracted by a 3D printer.

The machine looks similar to an ordinary printer and can print a "statue" in about 90 minutes after scanning anything, including a person.

The printer prints layer by layer (层) . For example, if we want to print a 30-cm-tall statue, the computer will calculate the layers and print 460 layers in total. It can also print people and clothes. You can stand for scanning for just about three minutes, and a statue will be finished about two hours. The cost for a statue of a man is about 1000yuan. The printer, which costs about 500,000yuan, is from the USA.

"We want to introduce this technology to people, and find more chances here." said an engineer, "There is a company in USA that offers 3D printing services to people. Many people come to design their own thing. It is very cool. We hope that the printer will encourage more Chinese people to be more creative."

Jack Ma, founder and chairman of China's e-commerce giant Alibaba, on Monday met with U.S. President-elect Donald Trump, and they discussed plans to help U.S. small businesses sell products to China through the company's platform.

"I think the president-elect is very smart, he's very open-minded to listen. I told him my ideas about how to improve trade, especially to improve small business, cross border trade (跨境贸易) ," Ma told reporters at Trump Tower in New York after meeting with Trump.

They also discussed the China-U.S. relationship, which should be "strengthened" and "more friendly", according to Ma. "Trump has concerns, and he has solutions, that he wants to discuss with China and us," he said.

"We had a great meeting, and a great, great entrepreneur (企业家) , one of the best in the world," Trump told reporters after the meeting. "Jack and I are going to do some great things."

Alibaba group said on Monday via its official twitter that the company works with U.S. companies and farmers to sell to over 450 million Chinese consumers on its platform, and it has set a goal of helping one million U.S. small businesses export to China.
