Chester Greenwood was born in Farmington in 1858. He invented earmuffs at the age of 15.

In 1873, Greenwood got a pair of ice skates for his birthday. He couldn't wait to try them out on a nearby pond. While testing his new pair of ice skates, Greenwood grew disappointed at trying to protect his ears from the cold. He made two ear-shaped loops from wire and asked his grandmother to sew for on them.

At first, the other kids made fun of them. Then they began asking for ear protectors for themselves. Over the next three years, he made some improvements.

When he was just 18, he patented the improved model, and with Greenwood's Champion Ear Protectors, he set up Greenwood's Ear Protector Factory. He made much money by



providing Ear Protectors for US soldiers during World War I. In 1883, when he was in his mid-20s, Greenwood employed 5, 000 workers in his factory on the west side of Farmington. In 1883 his factory produced many pairs of ear protectors. When asked about his wishes for 1884, Greenwood said, "We hope to produce one hundred thousand pairs." Greenwood went on to build a larger factory in downtown Farmington, making it the earmuff capital of the world. In 1936, the year before Greenwood died, his factory produced 400, 000 pairs of ear protectors.

In 1977, about 100 years after Greenwood received his patent, some people in Farmington decided that he deserved recognition for his famous invention. December 21 was declared as Chester Green-wood Day. On the first Saturday in December, Farmington still celebrates Chester Greenwood Day.
