In many countries, pets are well loved. In America, 95 percent of pet owners think of their animals as family members. About half buy them birthday gifts. And it's a **two-way street**. People who have pets tend to have lower blood pressure. They also have a lower heart-disease risk.

Scientists are finding more and more evidence that animals can also help improve mental health. Some clinics have been using "pit therapy" (宠物疗法) alongside traditional medicine. Here is a look at some of the cures.

Rabbits

In one study, scientists told a group of stressed-out adults to pat a rabbit and a rabbit toy. The toy had no effect. Touching the living rabbit, however, reduced anxiety (焦虑).

Crickets (蟋蟀)

Animals don't have to be soft and lovely to help. In a 2016 study, elderly people who were given five crickets in a cage felt happier after eight weeks. The act of caring of an animal seemed to make the difference.

Horses

Horses are among the most-studied therapy animals. In Europe, they have been involved in medical treatment plans since the 1860s. Activities like brushing the fur of a horse have been shown to reduce anxiety in people of all ages.

Fish

One of the study focused on people who had Alzheimer's disease (阿尔兹海默氏病). When they dined in front of a tank of colorful fish, they ate more.

Dogs

Children who struggle with reading are less anxious when they read aloud to a trained dog. Their attitudes change and their skills improve.

Cats are animals of habit. They like to go to sleep about the same time every day and for a certain length of time. They seem to have a natural clock inside them that tells them when to sleep and when to __75__.

“Dining out”, or “eating out”, are phrases people use in Britain when they eat in a restaurant or a pub. Eating out is more popular in Britain today than it has been ever been. In 2006, for the first time ever, British people spent more eating out in restaurants and pubs than cooking for themselves. It seems that many British people are becoming increasingly interested in how good their food tastes, and also how healthy it is.

However, eating out can also be expensive. Restaurants are more expensive than pubs, though many pubs serve very good, simple food. As we British people do no dine out every night of the week, eating in a restaurant is often seen as a special occasion(场合). When going on a first date and wanting to make a good impression on him or her, or if celebrating an anniversary or a birthday, then many people like to go to a restaurant to eat. People often eat in a restaurant before going to the cinema or the theatre.

Naturally, restaurants are greatly different in quality and price. However, almost all British cities have man kinds of food and culinary(烹饪的) styles to choose from including traditional

British food, and all from the very cheap to the very expensive ---French, Italian, Indian, Greek, Thai, Japanese and many, many more. In fact, when asked what their favorite food is, more British people say an Indian curry than any other dish!

As well as dining in a restaurant, when people are too tired too cook after work, they often get a “take-away”. This means that they order from a take-away restaurant by phone, and then go to collect it and take it home to eat. Many take-away restaurants also deliver it to your house(if you are especially tired, or lazy!) . And you can normally find a take-away restaurant for almost any cuisine, the most popular are pizza(Italian), Indian and Chinese---and all you have to do is open the door, pay and eat!
